### TEXTBOOK SCAVENGER HUNT

Identify as many of the following features as you can in the textbook your group is looking at. For each item you find, place a check in the box and write the page number(s) on which that feature can be found. If you cannot find a particular feature, place an "X" in the page number blank.

- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Bibliography:** A list of books, articles, etc., (containing author and publication information) referred to in a book, article, or chapter.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Boldface (bold) Type:** Type that is printed in a thick, black style, or "face" (**like this**).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Bulleted List:** A list of items within the text that is set off with some sort of dots (bullets).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Caption:** A title or brief description that goes with an illustration, picture, table, or graph (usually found beneath the picture).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Chapter Title:** The title of one of the main sections/divisions of a book or text.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Chart:** A sheet of information in the form of a table, graph, or diagram.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Column:** A vertical division of a page, chart, etc., containing a sequence of words or figures.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Color:** Use of colored text (e.g., not black text, which is typical) to emphasize a word, title, or concept.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Diagram:** A drawing showing the general scheme or outline of an object and its parts; may also indicate processes related to an object or procedure.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Figure:** A diagram, illustration, photograph that shows or reinforces a concept in the text.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Glossary:** An alphabetical list of terms, with definitions and sometimes pronunciations, that relates to a specific subject or text; typically placed at the end of a book.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Graph (line, bar):** A diagram showing a relationship, usually between two items, each measured along one of a pair of axes.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Graph (pie):** A circular diagram, typically showing the relationships among specific items.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Illustration/picture:** A painting, drawing, photograph, cartoon, etc., that illustrates a book, magazine, article, story, text, etc.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Indentation:** Space coming before a line of type, so that the type begins farther from the margin than other lines; used to mark a new paragraph or "set off" information from the rest of the text.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Index:** An alphabetical list of names, subjects, etc., with references (page numbers where the information can be found in the text); typically placed at the end of a book.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Italicized Type:** Type that is printed in a style, or "face," that has sloping letters (*like this*).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Keynote(s):** Short pieces of information pulled off to the side of the text, often in a box or additional column; keynotes may state the main ideas of a section, review key ideas or themes, or present interesting facts related to the reading.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Map:** Typically a flat representation of the earth's surface, or a part of it, showing physical features like cities, rivers, roads, oceans, countries, etc.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Preface:** An introduction to a book that states its subject, scope, purpose, and introduces the book's features; usually found at the beginning of a book.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Objectives (Learning Objectives):** A list of goals that you can accomplish by reading a chapter or section of text; often listed at the beginning of a textbook or chapter.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Questions:** Sentences that ask the reader to respond in some way, whether by thinking about something, writing something, doing something, or recalling facts from the reading.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Quotation:** A passage or remark which represents a specific statement (or part of a statement) made by another person.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Sidebar(s)/Pullbox(es):** Extra information box or column pulled off to the side of a page; often contains tangential (side-bar) information related to the text or expands on the ideas in the text.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Subtitle/Subheading:** A secondary or additional title of a book, work of art, piece of music, text, chapter, article, poem, or document. It is a secondary or additional heading within these works to indicate a subsection (or a topic WITHIN a larger topic or subject).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Summary:** A brief passage that reviews a larger section of the text or chapter; often found at the end of a section or chapter.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Symbols/Icons:** Small images used to alert the reader to a specific type of feature, question, or idea in a textbook; symbols/icons are re-used throughout the book.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Table:** A set of facts or figures arranged in a box; often a grid or a set of columns within the box.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Table of Contents:** A set of topics, listed with corresponding page numbers, indicating the different sections of a book or text.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Title Page:** A page that comes before the main part of a book or text (or chapter).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Title/Heading:** The name of a book, work of art, piece of music, text, chapter, article, poem, or document.
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Underlined (underscored) Type:** Type that is printed with a line beneath it (like this).
- \_\_\_\_\_ -- **Vocabulary Words:** A list of terms found within a given section of a chapter or textbook; often presented at the beginning (or end) of a chapter.
